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## **NEW HOME STUDY**

### **FALL/WINTER 2019/2020**

The canvas will be approximately 14" x 14". We don't have a price yet, but will advertise that as soon as we know. This design is a little different, not holiday based, but colorful and full of humor and fun. I hope that you are as excited as I am to see what comes from this piece of art.

I guess I better get cranking on that American Flag Needlepoint Mosaic before my next project arrives.





## **NEW PRODUCT**

### THREAD SLEEVES & PULLS

Thread Sleeves and Pulls from Edmar Co. are good for storing any pre-cut thread. Each strip of sleeves has two sections; a short section and a long section. Use the hooked pull strap to hold the thread at the folded end to pull it through the long section of the sleeve. Leave cut ends of the thread at one end of the long sleeve section and the folded end at the other, so you can easily grab one individual strand at the folded end and



slip it out without disturbing the rest of the strands. The lengths of thread are protected from dirt and snags while stored in the long sleeves. The short section of the sleeve is for a thread tag or label to be inserted so you always know what kind of thread and the color name or number at a glance. The large sheets of thread sleeves can be left flat in a drawer, folded in half or thirds, or rolled into a tube to slip down into a stitching tote or envelope.

Each page of thread sleeves will hold 16 individual threads.

## HOW DO I DO THAT?

### **HOW TO OPEN SKEINS OF VARIOUS THREADS**

### **BOUCLÉ**

These skeins of thread are dyed after the wound skein of thread has been tied, so there can be (usually is) a difference in color at the knotted area of the thread. If you open a skein of Boucle' incorrectly your thread can become tangled and/or unusable, so take note!

1. First, carefully pull the paper tag apart. It is a band that was slipped through the loop of thread and then the ends were glued together. The front and back of the paper tag will tear apart pretty easily. Save the tag. Slip the one looped end of the thread out of the other end and find the knotted tails of the thread in the loop. Unfold the skein the best you can, but it will stay pretty twisted until you can cut it.

2. With a sharp pair of scissors, cut through the skein of thread close to the knot and hold the skein up by one end of the cut thread and let the rest spin to untwist. Pull the knot away from the thread and trim it off.

3. If you wish to store the thread on the paper tag, refold the tag so both sides of the holes are back together. Fold the pre-cut thread and carefully pass it through the holes of the tag and slip the cut ends of the thread through the folded end of the thread to form a slip knot.

The hole is small and difficult to use for this, so you might consider a permanent storage on a Thread Drop or in a Thread Sleeve. This thread is the perfect candidate for using Thread Sleeves (see Feature Product on page 3). I do NOT recommend storing Boucle' folded or wound into a Floss-a-way Bag or other zippered bag.



## HOW DO I DO THAT?

### **HOW TO OPEN SKEINS OF VARIOUS THREADS**

### **KREINIK**

Did you know that many of the Kreinik Reels have a pop-up end? Kreinik Cord, Size 4 Braid, Size 8 Braid, Size 12 Braid, and 1/16" Ribbon (and a few other threads as well) are wound onto plastic reels that have flat ends that will pop away from the reel to release the thread and then pop down again to trap the tail of thread. This allows you to wind off the length you want, then pop the end back down on the cut end of thread to hold it in place and prevent major havoc in your thread bag created by unwound Kreinik. TIP! I have found that even if the flat end pops completely off the reel, it will still pop back onto the reel in most cases. The larger sizes of Kreinik (Size 16 & 32 Braid) are too thick to be trapped by a pop down end tab, so those thread reels have slots to a

If you are going to be using several lengths of Kreinik in your project and do not wish to keep popping the end up and down, you might consider using a Thread Bowl. We carry small ceramic bowls with a slot in the side that can hold your reel of Kreinik in the bowl and trap the cut end in the slot for fast and easy access.


## **BOOK REVIEW**


### BIT O' GLITTER

I have been having so much fun with the new Needlepoint Mosaic Series using shapes of different stitches to create borders and backgrounds, so when I spotted the Bit O' Glitter charts by Finger Step Designs I grabbed them up thinking how much fun for customers to use the ideas in these small (4" x 4" on #18 mesh) quiltlike patterns to create their own Needlepoint Mosaic designs. Using blank canvas and "stash" threads in color schemes that match your home decor these designs can be combined to create frames, larger pillows pictures...or a set of coasters if worked in the design size suggested. There are 6 designs total in the series, which are made up of various blocks and rectangles in different configurations. Each design is planned in two different color ways to give entirely different looks. As always, the text is clear and the diagrams are excellent and easy to follow.

Each of the projects in the Needlepoint Mosaic Series will be broken into 3 (possibly more in future projects) separate kits. The first kit will include the painted canvas, threads, and instructions for working a portion of the project. Each project stands alone, so it is your choice to sign up for just one project or sign up for several.

## **2019 NEEDLEPOINT MOSAICS**

### **SCALLOPED PINE**

Next up in our line up of Needlepoint Mosaics Scalloped Pine by 3 Kittens. 3 Kittens designs have hit the market with huge popularity. The designs are simple with lots of open space (perfect for embellishing with stitches) but complex in artistic nuance and sophistication. I like every canvas in their catalog and ordered many of them at the Orlando Market this year. I have been so lucky to find so many designers who are willing to paint a custom order canvas for me to work with and Julie Mast instantly was on board with the idea.

I have been playing with background areas first and created a chunk that looks a bit like tree bark. The lower left corner and left side are a variation of Vaulting Fans that seemed to offer a bit of a pine needle look. The lower right corner



is a doodle pattern that I developed a while ago and with a few additions and adjustments looked like fun to jazz up the border. That section still has another color to fill in, so it will change appearance as it progresses. The large remaining section in the background will be filled with Hungarian Point evergreen trees and sky. The border is planned but not completed and then I am on to the painted area in the middle of the canvas. All of the Needlepoint Mosaic Canvases have been tons of fun to work and I hope that you have found at least one of them that you could enjoy the learning and working experience. If not, we still have one more Needlepoint Mosaic project in the wings that might be just what you want.








## 2019 LIBRARY CLASS


